Fasting

Fast Day: Wednesdays and Fridays are fast days according to the ancient tradition of the Orthodox Church. On Wednesday, we recall the betrayal of Judas. On Friday, we recall the crucifixion of the Lord.

On fast days, we abstain from (a) all vertebrate products, including meat, dairy items, and fish (by "fish" we mean vertebrate fish; shellfish, however, may be consumed on any day), (b) olive oil, and (c) wine (as well as all alcohol).

*When certain Feasts fall on Wednesday or on Friday, consumption of oil and wine is permitted.
